Homework Assignments

This category on grading will vary from grade level to grade level as well as from grading period to grading period. We will sometimes have written assignments for the students to do. Examples of the types of assignments you may see: music theory worksheets, reflection assignments, research assignments.

Also included in this category is a notebook grade. The students have a great deal of things to focus on during the day and we want to make life as easy as possible for them so we have them keep everything they need for band in their notebook or case. See below for the list of required materials for the class. We check to make sure students

have the items necessary to be successful in band class. There will be at least 1 notebook grade per grading period. The notebook should be neat and have the following items in this order:

- Blank paper
- Divider labeled Notes
- Divider labeled Music (Sheet protectors go in this section)
- Divider labeled Worksheets/Written Work
- Divider labeled Other

Classroom Rules & Expectations

- Work hard and have fun
 - o Working hard and having fun is listed together as the number one rule because there must be a balance. If we only have fun, no work will get done. If we only work hard; we will not have any fun.
- Respect yourself, your classmates, and your instructors
 - Respect includes not talking over each other. We have a zero tolerance policy for bullying.
- Follow directions the first time they are given
- It is the student's responsibility to make up any assignment and contact Ms. Helms for any questions or makeup work. This includes actively checking Canvas and email for announcements and assignments.
- Only play your instrument or speak when prompted
- If it does not belong to you, do not touch it. (Examples: Percussion, An instrument that belongs to someone else, another person, etc.)
- No gum, food, or drinks other than water in the band room.
- Have your pencil, binder, instrument, instrument maintenance supplies, and any other necessary materials with you at the beginning of each class period.
- Each student is expected to be in attendance for every mandatory band event.
- Students are expected to practice 100 minutes a week which is about 20 minutes a day Monday through Friday
- It is your responsibility to care for your instrument.
- Any school-owned property is to be taken care of and returned in the condition it was loaned to you. (Example: Instrument, music, instrument maintenance supplies)
- Each student is expected to adhere to the dress code for performances.

Concert attire is concert black (white button-up shirts allowed). All performances require concert attire unless otherwise stated by Ms. Helms or Mr. Lukac

Technology

- Cellphones and laptops are not permitted during instruction and rehearsal unless otherwise specified by Ms. Helms or Mr. Lukac.
- The day after concert is a 'free block' for students. Students may use cellphones, laptops, and smaller video game devices (ex: Nintendo Switch, Nintendo DS, GameBoy, PSP, etc). This rule only applies for the days following concerts and for that block only. Ms. Helms and Mr. Lukac are not responsible for damages, lost, or stolen items and will not be willing to hold them for you. Other teachers do reserve the right to confiscate or give a write up if you are on the device without their permission. Ms. Helms and Mr. Lukac also reserve the right to take away the 'free block' due to misbehavior.

Students must have all materials no later than September 15

6th Grade students are expected to purchase a method book for band. This book is their personal band book. These books will be used on a daily basis in class (most homework will come from these books). The book needed is *Traditions of Excellence* Book 1 (red book) by Bruce Pearson and Ryan Nowlin. Books can be purchased through the Piedmont Band or through Music & Arts. If purchasing through Piedmont please make checks out to Piedmont Band Boosters. Book cost \$14 (listed for 12.99 but rounded up to cover shipping and tax). Money must be turned in by September 8.

Band is a performance-based class, so all concerts are required for every student. <u>Failure to attend the performance will result in an automatic 0 for the missed performance!!</u> All performances will be announced prior to the actual date, letters will be sent home, and will be posted on the band website, <u>www.pdmsband.org</u> Not all dates apply to all students! Please pay attention and read the descriptions of the events to find out what applies to you. Please put ALL dates for your student/grade level on your calendar now as to avoid conflicts

Event Description

8th Grade Band Night – Recruitment effort by the Piedmont HS Band program. Students will observe a high school football game from the band's point of view. Students will sit with the band and play pep tunes during the game, watch half time, and in general be treated like a HS band member. The students will receive free admission to the game.

Winter Concert -7^{th} , and 8^{th} grades will perform in the Auditorium. THIS IS REQUIRED OF 7^{th} and 8^{th} BAND STUDENTS.

All-District Audition – Competition against other students in the same grade levels in our 10 county area to receive a spot in the All-District Honors Band. Must know scales (memorized), solo, and sight-reading. 7th and 8th graders only.

All-District Band – Two day intensive band clinic held for students who auditioned and made the all-district band. **Overnight trip** to Belmont, NC.

County Band – All students interested in performing in the county honor band, should first audition for ALL-DISTRICT BAND. Students who completed a successful All-District audition will take precedence over students who did not. Students will be chosen to participate in County band by the band directors.

6th grade first concert- This is the first opportunity to hear the wonderful sounds coming from these young musicians!

"Piedmont-only" MPA Preview Concert – Pre-MPA evening concert held at the Piedmont High School Auditorium to prepare us to go to MPA. Required for 7th, 8th only.

Spring Concert – Evening concert, last concert of the year for Piedmont Middle Students.
